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NOTICE ON CASINO CHIPS

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 Pursuant to regulation 20(2) of the Casino Control (Gaming Equipment) Regulations 2009, gaming equipment for use in any casino shall comply with:
 - a. the Existing Notice (Version 4.0) until the Date of Cessation (inclusive); and
 - b. the New Notice (Version 5.0) from the Date of Commencement (inclusive).
- 1.2 All terms used in this notice, unless the context otherwise requires or otherwise defined, shall have the same meanings as in the Casino Control Act 2006 (the “Act”) and any regulations made thereunder as may be amended from time to time.
- 1.3 Any reference to legislation refers to such legislation as may be amended from time to time.

2. UNDERLYING PRINCIPLES

- 2.1 The evaluation of gaming equipment serves to ensure that the operation of a casino is and remains free from criminal influence or exploitation and that casino gambling and promotional games in a casino is conducted honestly.
- 2.2 Hence, all gaming equipment must be designed and manufactured to allow operations of a casino to be conducted in a manner that is honest, secure, auditable and reliable.

3. REQUIREMENTS FOR CASINO CHIPS

- 3.1 Casino chips shall be designed and manufactured with sufficient security features such that counterfeiting of the casino chips is prevented to the greatest extent reasonably possible.
- 3.2 Casino chips shall be designed such that casino chips of different denominations and uses (e.g. premium casino chips, different players’ roulette casino chips, promotional casino chips, souvenir casino chips, etc) are readily distinguishable.
- 3.3 Casino chips shall be designed such that the casino chips, even when stacked together, are identifiable to casino employees (including when viewed via any surveillance system of a casino operator).
- 3.4 Proposed casino chip designs shall first be submitted to the Authority for preliminary evaluation before production commences. The Authority reserves the right to review all actual production casino chips to ensure compliance with the initial proposed design before granting approval in accordance with the Act and any regulations made thereunder.

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- 3.5 There shall be sufficient security measures, internal controls and quality verification criteria in place during the manufacturing, quality control, packing, storage, delivery and destruction of the casino chips.

4. GENERAL

- 4.1 For the avoidance of doubt:-
- a. the contents of this document do not in any way affect the requirement for approval, if any, from the Authority under the Act or the regulations or rules made thereunder and any applicable laws;
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
